From the prez – April 2009

This is why we practice...

Headlines in just the past few weeks included these stories: "Magnitude 6.3 earthquake strikes central Italy", "Vandals cut fiber optic lines, disrupting communications for tens of thousands". While half a world apart, and significantly different in the scope of human suffering, these two events had something important in common. In both cases, amateur radio operators stepped up to fill the void caused by damage to the regular communications network. I am certain that the hams who stepped forward during these events shared some common traits. First, they had the desire to help others in time of an emergency. Then they acted upon this desire by taking steps to be prepared to help when the time came. They made sure their equipment was tested and ready to go, and that they had the knowledge needed to use their equipment. Finally, they practiced, to refine the skills to necessary to effectively communicate under difficult circumstances.

I am delighted to report that hams with many of the same traits reside right here in Mendocino County. This was clearly evident on April 2, 2009, when dozens of hams from across the county participated in an emergency communications drill with hospitals and clinics across the county. While some of these hams can claim to be seasoned emergency communicators, many have only recently begun to develop their emergency communications skills. All who participated, however, benefited from the practice that the drill provided.

None of us know when the next event that disrupts communications will strike Mendocino County, but all of us should realize that now is the time to prepare. Regular practice leads to the skills and confidence needed to perform when the chips (and regular lines of communications) are down. Another countywide emergency communications exercise, this time involving the school district offices, is being planned for May 13.
